What an incredible year it's been! Thanks to your support, we've continued to celebrate, share, and grow the spirit of Japanese and Japanese American (JA) culture in ways that brought joy, connection, and meaning to so many.

This year with did something brand new and unique: our very first **Spirit of Japan Denver** event! Sold out crowds were buzzing with energy as they savored Japanese street and festival food, sipped curated Japanese spirits, and took in the vibrant atmosphere. It was a beautiful reminder of how powerful cultural celebration can be when we gather as a community.



We marked a true milestone with the **50th Annual Denver Cherry Blossom Festival**, which we again co-presented with Tri-State/Denver Buddhist Temple (TSDBT). With an estimated 30K-35K attendees, Sakura Square was alive with Japanese and JA sights, sounds, and flavors. It was a joyful showcase of heritage, creativity, and community spirit.

Our passion for passing on cultural knowledge to the next generation was stronger than ever. **Chibi no Gakkō** welcomed a record-breaking 42 students in 2024! Go For Broke National Education Center accepted three Denver candidates into their **National Torchbearer Program** centered around civic dialogue and community building, and four Colorado middle-schoolers attended **Yo! Camp** based in Southern California. We couldn't be more excited about the future that all of these groups represent.

Throughout the year, we also made cultural connections through our **Card Making Class**, where participants learned Japanese techniques in a warm, creative setting. The **Nikkei Treasures** pop-up at Sakura Square (in partnership with TSDBT) offered new and gently used Japanese items for sale, raising funds to support the redevelopment of this cherished community space.

Of course, none of this would be possible without you: our donors, volunteers, sponsors, members, and friends. Your generosity and commitment fuel everything we do. Together, we're not just preserving culture, we're building a more resilient, equitable, and compassionate community.

SHAPING THE FUTURE THROUGH PROGRAMMING

TORCHBEARERS

The Go For Broke National Education Center's National Torchbearer Program fosters the spirit of courage, sacrifice, and civic responsibility by engaging young leaders in meaningful dialogue and social issues. Launched in 2022, the program brings together diverse participants to explore topics of privilege, discrimination



participants to explore topics of privilege, discrimination, and community building.



In 2024, Torchbearers convened 27 Fellows from across the country, including four from Denver: Kendall Kunitake, Tiffany Lin, Sara Ozawa, and Brent Sabati. The program began with a gathering at Little Tokyo in Los Angeles, where participants discussed issues such as the unhoused, migration, and how to navigate difficult conversations. The second convening took place in Denver in October, where Fellows explored Colorado's Japanese American history, visited significant sites such as Sakura Square and the Nisei Veterans Memorial at Fairmount Cemetery, and engaged in discussions on gun control, immigration, and the political climate.



YO! CAMP



Sakura Foundation was excited to continue its partnership with **Yo! Camp**, a week-long summer camp in Calabasas, CA that connects middle schoolers from Southern California, Chicago, Denver, and Seattle through engaging team-based activities. The camp provides a fun and safe environment for students of all backgrounds and ethnicities to experience Japanese/JA culture.

In its second year of participation, Sakura Foundation supported two counselors and four campers from Denver. With a total attendance of 140 campers, Yo! Camp continues to provide an unforgettable experience that fosters community, cultural learning, and lifelong friendships and memories.

SHAPING THE FUTURE THROUGH PROGRAMMING

Chibi no Gakkō







Chibi no Gakkō is a JA culture and heritage program that offers first through eighth graders a hands-on opportunity to explore the JA experience. Held every-other year, Chibi welcomed a record-high 42 students in its second session since partnering with Sakura Foundation. This milestone reflects the growing enthusiasm for cultural education and community connection among young participants from all walks of life.

Students were engaged in activities such as discovering their family and JA history, cooking Japanese cuisine, playing traditional games, learning dances and songs, and creating Japanese arts and crafts. High school students who completed the program returned as mentors, fostering leadership and community engagement. Lead teachers of Chibi are certified by the State of Colorado and generously volunteer their immense talents and time to the program.




